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

## Dear Year 10 Parent or Carer

I wrote to you earlier this week to outline our plans for the week of Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June, when we will provide core subject 'face to face' teacher support for Year 10 students (RE, English, Maths and Science).

I can now confirm the detailed arrangements.

For the week of Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June, two tutor groups will attend school each day

Attached to the bottom of this letter is a link to a form where we ask for you to confirm your child will attend on their allocated day and also to indicate if you give permission for your child to leave school at 1.40pm when lessons have finished. **Please submit this by 6.00pm on Sunday 21**st **June.** 

We have to continue to meet the Government guidance of no more than 25% of a year group in at any one time, so there is no flexibility around the day your child can attend this provision – they must attend on the allocated day for their tutor group.

For Year 10 students who attend the keyworker provision they will attend this 'face to face' learning on their allocated day until 1.40pm when they will then return to their keyworker group for the afternoon session.

As students are in for most of the day, they will be required to wear uniform, however blazers are not required. Students must bring their books and equipment for the appropriate lessons each day.

## What will happen during the Core Subject Day?

The two tutor groups each day have been arranged into eight groups, with teaching groups of approximately 7-8 students. These have been organised using information from both academic and pastoral staff and cannot be affected by student / parental preferences.





Students are asked to arrive at school promptly at 8.45am and gather on the sunken lawn, where there will be large marquees - which can be used in the event of rain. At 9.00am teaching staff will collect their group from the sunken lawn and move, via a hand washing activity, to their allocated classroom in Kolbe block, where your child will spend the majority of the core subject day. Each Lab has running water for hand washing and has been adapted to ensure 2m social distancing is possible.

## **Example Day**

Period 1 will run from 9.20-10.20am. At the end of Period 1, the teaching group will remain in the same classroom and a teacher from another core subject will take over. Period 2 will run from 10.20-11.20am. Break will be from 11.20-11.40am, when students will be supervised on the sunken lawn to ensure social distancing is maintained. There will be no opportunity to purchase food or drink, so students must bring all refreshments with them.

At the end of break, students will return to their allocated room and then Period 3 will run from 11.40am to 12.40pm with a third subject specialist. Finally, Period 4 will run from 12.40-1.40pm with a fourth subject specialist subject. At 1.40pm, all students will be free to leave site and return home or to the keyworker provision. If you wish for your child to remain on site, arrangements will be made to facilitate this.
