CRIME AND DEVIANCE — CAN YOU EXPLAIN EACH TREND?

-80-90% of offenders are male.

-Women are more likely to be convicted of shoplifting and males violent offences.

-Males are more likely to be convicted of offences, compared to women.

-74% of the prison population are unemployed or employed in the lowest occupational level. Only 8% of offenders are middle class.

-Burglary, street robbery, shoplifting, violence against the person is committed by young people aged 17-24.
