Task 1

Create a mood board/collection of images of New Objectivity, The World is Beautiful and Albert Renger-Patzsch.

Task 2

Write a minimum of 500 words about the work of Albert Renger-Patzsch and the New Objectivity. Focus on...

- His attitude to photography and the advantages of the camera.
- The types of subjects he preferred to photograph
- The ways in which he explored the formal elements in his work e.g. form, light, rhythm, line, texture, repetition etc.
- His famous book 'The World is Beautiful'
- Other photographers at the time who were similarly interested in objectivity
- Contemporary photographers who have been influenced by the idea that ordinary objects and scenes can be photographed to reveal their beauty.

Task 3

Write a minimum of 500-word analysis where you compare and contrast two of Renger-Patzsch's images. Use the prompts available on the website to help you to do this.

Task 4

Create your own collection of (roughly or as close to as possible) 100 images that show the world is beautiful.

Use what you have learnt from your research into Renger-Patzsch.

You can use whatever you have available to take the photographs, your phone, a compact camera or even a DSLR (if you have one).

Task 5

Using any free editing software you can, (or Photoshop/Lightroom if you have it at home) edit your photographs to make them fit the aesthetic of New Objectivity.

You may want to turn them black and white, increase the brightness or contrast or add a filter.

Task 6

Present your images alongside a minimum 500 word formal evaluation of your work in this project. Use these prompts to help you.

- To what extent are Renger-Patzsch's images truthful? How does your own work reflect this?
- What elements of Renger-Patzsch's work have you applied in your own work?
- Why do you think he entitled his famous book, 'The World is Beautiful'?
- Why might photographers at the same point in history have been interested in photographing the world in this way?
- What do you think Photography has gained by the New Objectivity movement? Is it still relevant today?
