At this time of year, it is not unusual for parents of students that have left Oaklands to write back to the school to thank teachers for the experience their child received. Year 11 Mocks

The mock examinations for Year 11 will take place towards the end of the term, details will be issued by separate letter. Students can prepare for these by starting their revision now. Almost all Year 11 students have met with a member of our Senior Leadership Team and have analysed their end of Year 10 test results and discussed revision strategies needed to help them achieve their full potential.

Homework for Year 7

It has been encouraging to see our Year 7 students make such a positive start to their time at Oaklands. The phased introduction of homework to this year group continues after half term with the addition of Geography, History and Modern Foreign Languages (French and Spanish). Expectations

Our expectations, as you would want them to be, are high. Our teachers are continuously improving the quality of their teaching and the standard of feedback, together with target setting to ensure that your child knows what to do to in order to succeed. We continue to embed the 'Oaklands Way' which offers teachers excellent ways to be effective and to promote student learning through a consistent approach. It supports teacher planning, motivates students and re-energises classroom activity.

The atmosphere that is created within a classroom by staff and students alike is crucial with regard to maximising progress. Students must arrive ready to learn; this includes having the correct equipment and a reading book. I would ask that over half term you check your child's school equipment and replace anything that is missing or broken. If any family is struggling with the cost of these items, please contact your child's Head of Year and we can provide subsidised equipment.

Parents select Oaklands for several reasons, including the ambitious standards we set. There are a number of 'red lines' over which children should not cross. For example, if a student uses abusive language, they will be given an appropriate sanction.

Conversely, if a child's behaviour or effort should be rewarded, we will praise them either verbally, through written comment or by awarding praise points - these can be seen on ClassCharts. We are delighted with how many praise points have been awarded across the year groups already, particularly for our restorative justice approach, which sees students taking responsibility for repairing broken relationships. It is crucial that you have access to this as valuable information about your child's education, including important announcements are placed on there.

Positive behaviour is a fundamental part of the school's ethos as it impacts on the daily life of everyone in the school and the wider community. The Havant Federation of Schools, of which Oaklands is a part, has issued several joint statements regarding a collective approach to reinforcing high standards across a range of school issues which we support. The statements can be found on our website, *Havant Federation Joint Statements*, and focus on:

- Relational Conflict and Bullying
- Mobile Phones and Social Media
- Standards, Expectations and Attendance

I would ask that you take time to read them again as they form the basis of the approach taken by all schools in the Havant area.

Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth

The Catholic Diocese has recently unveiled its draft Ten Year Plan. This is an ambitious project which has considered the survey of 1,000 voices undertaken by the Diocese, as well as the synodal process requested by Pope Francis.
