## Dear Parents and Carers

Your child will be choosing their options for Key Stage 4 courses in January 2023.
So that we can offer the best combination of subjects for your child we would like to gather reasonably accurate information from Year 9 regarding the most popular subjects for GCSE study. This year we are sending home a preliminary survey to gather this information.

## The subjects that are chosen at this stage are not option choices but will provide a useful indication of the most popular subject choices.
