Dear Parents and Carers

I would like to thank all parents for their support so far this year, the academic year has not been without its challenges and successes. Our home school partnership is the bedrock of our success and excellent reputation in the community. Whilst I don't court feedback from parents it is always pleasing when they talk about the outstanding pastoral care youngsters or families have received, particularly so when situations are difficult as they are for many families at the present time.

Uniform

Half term provides parents with an opportunity to resolve uniform issues. I have spoken to a number of students about non-regulation footwear. I was astounded when one youngster told me that his trainers cost £160, this is considerably more than a pair of school shoes. Students need to wear shoes that accord with the uniform policy. Our <u>school policy</u> makes it clear that trainers should not be worn. Recently, a number of shoe manufacturers have started to market trainers masquerading as school shoes. I think we would all agree that the models on the left and centre are trainers and the model on the right is a shoe.



If you are buying new school shoes over half term, please ensure that they comply with the school policy. If you are aware that your child has 'non-compliant' footwear we will be allowing a period of grace, however this issue needs to be resolved as soon as possible.

All other uniform issues should be resolved before we return.

Piercings

Again, we would respectfully ask that you do not put your child in a position where they present in a manner that is in tension with the school policy.

Student Equipment

Could I please ask that during half term, you check and ensure your child has a pen, pencil, colouring pencils, ruler, and a calculator. Without these items the start to lessons are delayed and learning time is lost to giving out and loaning equipment.

My team have now set to work on the curriculum model. Inevitably we will not be able to please all students; this was made clear during the Options Evening. Attendance

We received notification at the end of last term that we are in the top 25% of schools across the country for attendance; this is despite some rather ferocious seasonal bugs. As we move into the spring, I hope that attendance will improve further.

Road Safety

Once again, we have been experiencing difficulties with parents/carers not following the highway code whilst they are on the school site. In particular, students are being dropped off on the roundabout at the top of the main entrance road which causes an obstruction to other traffic and blocks the entrance to the staff and visitors' car park off the roundabout. There is also a real danger of a student being injured, or worse, by cars who are trying to squeeze past those cars that are stopping inconsiderately on the roundabout. This area is now being monitored by CCTV.

Parents and carers dropping their children off at school are kindly reminded that they must stop by the kerb closest to the bus shelters and get their children to safely alight onto the path. This leads to a newly marked-out pedestrian crossing which should be used to safely walk to the playground area and school buildings.

Road safety is also being compromised by parents parking their cars on site up to an hour or more before children are due to leave school. This causes obstructions for the school buses getting on site and leaving in a safe manner. Please help us keep your children safe by not entering the site to pick up before 3.50pm, when the entrance gate will be opened and 2-way traffic can resume.
