

Chemistry Olympiad

Year 8 STEM Showcase

Over the past six weeks, Year 8 students have been carrying out their own Science projects. Students have researched their chosen topics, proposed hypotheses and completed practical testing to collect data and present their findings. These were then showcased on Thursday 6th June to parents, teachers and governors, who heard two talks from Sixth Form students about their CREST awards. The winners, Braydan, Amelia and Athena from 8 St Teresa were then announced at the end of the evening.

Primary Science Outreach

On Monday 11th and Tuesday 12th June, the Science Department welcomed Year 5 classes from St Peter's Catholic Primary School and St Thomas More's Catholic Primary School for an afternoon of Secondary School chemistry! Students completed an experiment using filtration and evaporation to get salt crystals in their pure form from a mixture of sand and salt.

The results from both classes were fantastic, and Mrs Hardaker, Miss Lenihan and I were hugely impressed! We look forward to welcoming further classes in a few weeks, and it is fantastic to hear that many of these brilliant Scientists will be joining us in a year or so! Mr Semple
