Geography Trip to Iceland 19th July - 23rd July 2026

The Geography department have run many successful trips to Iceland since 2006; it is a remarkable place and is often described as the land of 'Fire and Ice'.

44 places will be on offer for the trip. If we don't get to 44, the next target is 40 to make the trip viable, but the cost would be higher. 32 is the lowest number we can take, but the cost would be even higher still. However, previous experience has shown that the trip is often over-subscribed. <u>All</u> students in current Years 10 (29 places), 11 and 12 (15 places) will be eligible to attend the trip. Places will be transferred to other year groups if they do not fill their allocation. If the trip is over-subscribed, places will be allocated by means of a draw - <u>students studying GCSE or A level Geography will be given preference</u>.

Itinerary (provisional, although the dates are fixed – all swimming optional):

- ❖ Sunday 19th July: Leave Oaklands at 8am and fly to Keflavik (Iceland Air), arriving early afternoon. Our first stop will be the Gunnuhver Geothermal area and 'The Bridge between two Continents'. We will then visit the Blue Lagoon health spa for a couple of hours Welcome To Blue Lagoon Iceland Resort & Spa | Blue Lagoon Iceland and have a pizza meal in Reykjavik after. We will arrive at the Hjardarbol Guest House, which is located between Hvergerdi and Selfoss − click here for their website.
- Monday 20th July: Boat trip to Vestmannaeyjar islands (Heimaey) scene of the 1973 eruption. Climb the Eldfell volcano and visit the 'Pompeii of the North'- buried houses under ash and lava. Take a coach tour around the island. Swim in the outdoor pool on Heimaey, which is a fantastic pool. Visit the Gluggafoss waterfall once back on the mainland.
- ❖ Tuesday 21st July: The 'Golden Circle' Kerid volcanic crater, Faxafoss waterfall, watch the Strokkur geyser erupt at Geysir, Gulfoss waterfall, Thingvellir (where the plates are moving apart) and Ljosafoss Hydro-electric power station/Science exhibit.
- ❖ Wednesday 22nd July: Seljalandsfoss waterfall, Skogafoss waterfall, Solheimajokull glacier walk (crampons, ice axes and tour guides a real highlight). Basalt columns at Reynisfjara, Vik and coastal scenery at Dyrholaey.
- ❖ Thursday 23rd July: Visit the capital, Reykjavik. Visit the Hallgrímskirkja church, concert hall, City Hall and the main shopping areas. Leave Keflavik early afternoon and return home about 8pm.

If there is inclement weather, the itinerary could change. However, we have not had to do this on our previous trips. I try to pack in as much as we can in the time that we have there, so the days are extremely busy. Students will need to be reasonably fit and be able to cope with the physical exertion and the long days.

Accommodation is on a full board basis and we will stay at the Hjardarbol Guest House; we really enjoyed our stay there in August 2025. Cereals and toast are provided in the morning, students make their own packed lunches after breakfast and a two-course hot meal is provided in the evening. All excursions will have been paid for in advance, but students will need to take some spending money (Icelandic Krona) if they want to purchase additional snacks, drinks or souvenirs. Students will also be advised to eat a meal at the airport on the day of departure, so will need money for this too.

If we get 44 students, the cost will be £1528 (although add £15 to this if 16 or over at the time of travel to cover the UK Air Passenger Duty tax). If we get to 40, the cost will be £1557. If we only get to 32, the price will be £1613. Last year, we took 44, so I would hope that we would get a similar figure this year.

Reply slips (not the deposit payment) should be handed in to the Finance Office by 4:00pm Friday 26th September. If the trip is over-subscribed by this date, places will be allocated by means of a draw. Parents will then be informed whether their child has been successful in gaining a place on the trip and a reserve list will be generated. Once informed by the school, deposits of £300 are payable by Thursday 2nd October 2025 to secure the place on the trip (the travel company have stipulated that the deposit needs to be £300 to secure the flights).

I am conscious that £1528 is high, but Iceland is

an expensive country to visit I am afraid. I still

believe this represents good value, given the

number of things we pack in to our trip.

All remaining payments (6) will be payable by:

- Second payment 3rd November 2025 £150
- Third payment 5th January 2026 £150
- Fourth payment 2nd February 2026 £232
- Fifth payment 2nd March 2026 £232
- Sixth payment 13th April 2026 £232
- Seventh and final payment 11th May 2026 £232 (or £247 if 16 or over)

Seventinanu ililai payment – 11 ililay 2020 - £252 (of £247 il 16 of over)

N.B. I will revise the payment plan if we only get to 40 (£1557) or 32 (£1613) and inform parents of the new arrangement.

As this trip is non-curricular, the school normally is unable to offer financial assistance and therefore the full cost of the activity must be borne by yourselves. Payments and accompanying paperwork must be handed in on or before the deadline date outlined above and late payments will jeopardise your child's place on the trip/activity. Should your child withdraw from the activity, please be aware that deposits are non-refundable. Any further payments can only be refunded if the place can be filled by another student on a waiting list, or if the withdrawal is for an insurable reason.

If there are any significant changes to the costs of the trip, these may have to be passed on to the student. Be assured that we will try to keep such costs to a minimum.
