Dear Parents and Carers

The summer break seems all but a distant memory now and students have been at school for eight weeks. Within this letter there are a number of links to important documents that can be found on our school website. I would encourage all parents to read these.

So much has already been accomplished this year, highlighted by the numerous enriching experiences we have enjoyed during our Culture Week activities this week. The mock examinations for Year 11 will take place towards the end of the term; details have been issued by separate letter. Students should already be preparing for these. Next half term, Year 11 students will meet with a member of our Senior Leadership Team to discuss revision and plans for next year.





Homework

It has been encouraging to see our Year 7 students make such a positive start to their time at Oaklands. The phased introduction of homework to this year group continues after half term with the addition of Geography, History and Modern Foreign Languages (French and Spanish). The homework timetable can be found on the school website by following *this link*.

Over the years, homework has featured as a regular topic, parents talk of too much or too little in equal measure. This year we have altered the frequency of homework for all students in Key Stage 3. Additional homework tasks to stretch and challenge students can be found on the school website by following *this link*.

Expectations

Our expectations, as you would want them to be, are high. Our teachers are continuously improving the quality of their teaching and the standard of feedback, together with target setting to ensure that your child knows what to do to in order to succeed. The atmosphere that is created within a classroom by staff and students alike is crucial with regard to maximising progress. Students must arrive ready to learn; this includes having the correct equipment and a reading book. I would ask that over half term you check your child's school equipment and replace anything that is missing or broken. If any family is struggling with the cost of these items, please contact your child's Head of Year and we can provide preloved or subsidised equipment.

We are delighted with how many praise points have been awarded across the year groups already. Parents can access these through the ClassCharts App. Details can be found by following this link. If you have any issues logging into ClassCharts or would like your login details, please email classcharts@oaklandscatholicschool.org. It is crucial that you have access to this, as valuable information about your child's education, including important announcements are placed on there.

Positive behaviour is a fundamental part of the school's ethos as it impacts on the daily life of everyone in the school and the wider community. The Havant Federation of Schools, of which Oaklands is a part, has issued several joint statements regarding a collective approach to reinforcing high standards across a range of school issues which we support. The statements can be found on our website, <u>Havant</u> <u>Federation Joint Statements</u>, and focus on:

- Relational Conflict and Bullving
- Mobile Phones and Social Media
- Standards, Expectations and Attendance
- Vaping and Smoking

I would ask that you take time to read them again as they form the basis of the approach taken by all schools in the Havant area.

Cycling to School

When the clocks go back and the nights draw in, the British weather invariably gets worse which leads to a loss of visibility on the roads, and pedestrians and cyclists are particularly vulnerable. Whilst I would want to encourage students to cycle, they must wear an appropriate safety helmet. We all know that a cycle helmet can be a life saver.

Building Works

As you know we were successful with two Capital Improvement Fund (CIF) projects. The school is undergoing major capital works on the Sports Hall and the White House. The Sports Hall will have a new roof that will be installed over the course of this academic year. The White House project is focused on structural works internally, along with an updated porch and renewal of part of the rendering externally.

Parent Parking and End of the Day Routines

As I mentioned in my September letter, due to the current building works, there are significantly less parking spaces available and we cannot accommodate any parents parking and waiting on site unless they have a pre-arranged meeting and have signed in at Reception.

In the morning, children should be dropped off on the school drive by the bus shelters. There is no capacity for parents to park on site and wait for friends to arrive or for the bell to ring.

An increasing number of parents are still driving onto the school site before the end of the day. This is not permitted and the main gates to the school will now be closed during the afternoon until 3.50pm, once the school buses have left. Please do not come on to site early and park your car and wait; if you do this you will be asked to leave. This is to ensure that all students are safeguarded and no authorised persons are present on the site.

I have asked my staff to take the registration plate of any car that contravenes the systems we have put in place and identify the parents concerned. Our driveway is now monitored by CCTV.

Finally, it is concerning that a small number of parents, when challenged about parking, have been rude and aggressive towards staff. Oaklands grounds are private property, my Governors will not hesitate to ban parents who are rude, aggressive or threating to staff.

A reminder of the FAQs regarding transport issues is at the end of this letter.

DocsPlus

As part of our review of available provision, we have now subscribed to DocsPlus, this is a reading and writing tool for secondary school students that can be used to support the completion of written work as well as providing additional support for reading extended text. This link, <u>DocsPlus - secondary writing</u> <u>support software</u> will give you an indication of what this application can provide.

Whilst students with an agreed access arrangement to use a laptop may be able to use this in class, all students have access to the programme at home if they wish to use it to support home study and independent revision. This can be downloaded to a PC, laptop or tablet. It is not compatible with a phone due to the size of the screen.

The student should then use their school email address to register. This is usually in the format of "firstname.surname@oaklandscatholicschool.org"; this is part of their 365 account – Outlook.

Transport Related FAQs

Where do I drop my child off in the morning?

Children should be dropped off on the school drive by the bus shelters. Please note that this is a 'drop off' area only as access is required by buses and other parents. Please only use the visitors' car parks if you have an appointment or need to visit Reception. No parking is permitted in other areas of the school.

What time do students finish?

At the end of the day, the dismissal of Key Stages will be staggered (KS3 at 3.25pm, KS4 and KS5 at 3.30pm). Students will be escorted down the drive by their class teachers. Students will need to leave the school site as soon as their day ends in order to clear the buildings. Students should go straight home. Key Stage 3 students will be permitted to board buses as soon as they arrive. In the event of bad weather and a known delay to buses, students will be given the option of waiting in the Hall.

What time are the school gates open?

The school gates will not open until 3.50pm, as the buses need to vacate the drive. Please do not try to park in front of the school gate before 3.50pm as you could obstruct buses that are trying to enter the site.

What time do the buses arrive?

The buses should be on site by 3.20pm ready for the first students. If a bus is late, the school will contact the bus company.

If I am collecting my child by car where do I pick them up from?

You will drive on to the school site at 3.50pm (no earlier), around the roundabout then back down the drive. The pick-up point is on the playing field side of the drive. Parents must not stop on the bus shelter side of the driveway or on the roundabout.

Where can I park locally to wait for my child?

Parking approximately 10 minutes walk away from the school site is the best option if you are picking up your child by car. Please park with consideration for local residents. If you park in roughly the same area each time your child will become familiar with this. You will then be on your way by approximately 3.40pm rather than waiting until 3.50pm for the gates to open.

Am I permitted to collect my child from the school site on foot?

No: the school drive is very busy and parents will need to wait outside of the gates.
