Assessment Tasks/ method and frequency	Class assessment is an ongoing focus, with staff marking and assessing practice answers at frequent intervals. The use of SIR (Strength, Improvement and Response) marking enhances the effectiveness of this process. There will be two formal examinations in January and March, but there will also be frequent tests in class to improve timed writing: speed and accuracy.
Parents/Carers can help by	Encouraging students to spend time reading the set texts in quiet surroundings. Buy newspapers and encourage a climate of reading non-fiction and discussing topics to establish point of view and ways of expressing this. Encourage students to attend the after school revision classes.
